Bakala Scholar Playing First Fiddle

Matouš Michal, who received the Zdeněk Bakala Foundation scholarship in 2010 to support his studies at the prestigious Juilliard School of Music in the US, has been appointed concertmaster of the Juilliard Orchestra. "This is a huge step up on my career ladder. As the orchestra's leader, the concertmaster is responsible for guiding and encouraging the rest of the players – and that demands excellent leadership skills. Whenever the conductor has any objections or suggestions for improvement, he turns to the concertmaster for advice. The concertmaster must then communicate the message to all orchestra members." What is Matouš's advice for students who hope to attend Juilliard? "Practice, practice, practice. But besides that, the most important thing about the interviews is to make an impression as a personality and artist who has – and stands by – his or her own views. It is also vital that students not underestimate the comprehensive preparation for the exams, and that they learn in advance exactly what the admission procedure entails. If you are admitted to Juilliard, you will face tough competition, but you will also enjoy a wonderful atmosphere with mutual artistic enrichment and influence among students." Matouš will perform in the Czech Republic in late May and early June.
